


CLIMBING WALL & GAMES



When roads are constructed in the city they have generally been built with 25 feet of asphalt in a 56 foot right of way with 18 inches of a cement asphalt container on each side of the road. In other words, the 56 foot right of way is property that belongs to the public, i.e. the Woodland Hills City. This means that there are around 14 feet on each side of the asphalt and cement container for the ditch works, any trails, sidewalks, etc. Further, often times utilities are layed in this area, running down or up the street. This 56 foot right of way can meander somewhat as the asphalt has not always been placed exactly in the middle of the 56 foot right of way. A survey is required to see exactly where the right of way is located. It may be closer to the owners personal property than originally planned or thought. Some people are using the space in front of their property to beautify their lots, planting trees or grass, installing planters for shrubbery, placing decorative rocks, building momunents to identify driveway entrances, etc. As a reminder, this right of way distance is city property and does not belong to the adjacent property owners, on each side of the road. While the efforts are laudable to beautify ones property, we need to be reminded that this property belongs to the city and a time may come when utility work along the road needs to be done and these beautification features may need to be removed at the property owners expense if they did not have city permission to build or construct them, all in order to replace or repair the particular utility being worked on or installed. This being the case it is highly likely that one will never be given approval to install these beautification items on city property and you proceed at your own risk. Also to keep in mind, should your beautification efforts in some way cause or contribute to an accident, you could be held liable for the not approved construction, done on the city's property, and in the corresponding right of way. This is not to say that anyone who has done these beautification efforts could be in violation of city ordinances due to the meandering nature of the road and right of ways throughout the city.

As everyone can see, the weeds around the city on vacant lots, roadside, etc. abound. With the rain they are likely to grow a little taller. Please everyone give some attention to weeds and tall grass on your property. The fire which started several weeks ago up around Ogden resulted from a car pulling off the road and igniting some weeds/grass growing along side the road. If we all do our part it will help considerably. Thanks in advance and we appreciate the work that has already been done.



TED TALKS

TED TALK - THE FIRE AND EMS SERVICE

OCCASIONALLY, I GET ASKED, "DOES OUR SMALL COMMUNITY NEED A FIRE AND EMS DEPARTMENT?". WHILE I'LL LEAVE IT UP TO A PERSONAL DECISION, I'D LIKE TO PROVIDE SOME INFORMATION TO HELP IN THE ASSESSMENT.

OUR FIRE AND EMS DEPARTMENT WAS OFFICIALLY ESTABLISHED IN 1995 BY A COUPLE OF RESIDENTS WHO WERE CONCERNED ABOUT BEING ABLE TO QUICKLY RESPOND TO AN EMERGENCY IN OUR CITY. SINCE THEN, IT HAS GROWN TO APPROXIMATELY 24 VOLUNTEER MEMBERS, 14 WHO ARE CERTIFIED FIREFIGHTERS TO THE SAME LEVEL AS CAREER FIREFIGHTERS. OF THE 14 CERTIFIED FIREFIGHTERS, WE HAVE NINE WHO ARE CROSS-CERTIFIED AS EMTS AND AN ADDITIONAL SIX PERSONNEL WHO ARE CERTIFIED EMTS ONLY. THESE CERTIFICATIONS AND RESPONSES TO EMERGENCIES REQUIRE HUNDREDS OF HOURS OF DONATED VOLUNTEER TIME EACH YEAR.

·THE APPARATUSES CONSIST OF STRUCTURE FIRE ENGINES, WILDLAND, FIRE ENGINES, AND A MEDICAL RESCUE/AMBULANCE.

•THE DEPARTMENT RESPONDS TO BETWEEN 80-100 EMERGENCY CALLS ANNUALLY WITH LIFE-SAVING EQUIPMENT AND MINIMAL RESPONSE TIMES, FROM PAGE OUT TO ON SCENE IN LESS THAN 10 MINUTES, WHEN MINUTES COUNT.

WE HAVE MUTUAL AID AGREEMENTS WITH SEVERAL NEIGHBORING AGENCIES, WHICH ALLOW US TO HELP EACH OTHER WITHOUT COSTS TO THE LOCAL COMMUNITY. WITHOUT THIS AGREEMENT, WE COULD BE CHARGED FOR A NEIGHBORING COMMUNITY PROVIDING COVERAGE.

THE DEPARTMENT RUNS A FULL-TIME WILDLAND CREW DURING WILDFIRE SEASON. THIS CREW RESPONDS TO NATIONAL FIRES UNDER STATE CONTRACTS, WHICH GENERATES REVENUE FOR THE CITY. ADDITIONALLY, THEY WORK ON CITY WILDLAND MITIGATION PROJECTS WHEN THEY ARE NOT RESPONDING TO A NATIONAL EVENT.

·THE FIRE AND EMS BUDGET IS GENERALLY 12-15% OF THE CITY'S OVERALL BUDGET. HOWEVER, THIS BUDGET IS OFFSET BY THE REVENUE GENERATED BY THE WILDLAND CREW. REDUCING THE TOTAL CITY BUDGET TO BETWEEN 5%-10% OF THE OVERALL BUDGET.

PROBABLY THE MOST OVERLOOKED BENEFIT TO THE COMMUNITY IS THE CONSIDERATION FOR HOMEOWNER INSURANCE COMPANIES. HOMEOWNERS' INSURANCE IN WILDLAND INTERFACE COMMUNITIES IS CURRENTLY A HOT TOPIC AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL. A LOT OF HOMEOWNERS ARE BEING DROPPED BY THEIR INSURANCE COMPANIES AND SCRAMBLING TO GET COVERAGE, INCLUDING YOURS TRULY. EACH COMMUNITY RECEIVES AN INSURANCE SERVICES OFFICE (ISO) RATING BASED ON ITS EFFECTIVENESS FOR FIRE PROTECTION. THIS RATING, DETERMINED BY FACTORS LIKE THE LOCAL FIRE DEPARTMENT'S CAPABILITIES (PERSONNEL, TRAINING, EQUIPMENT, AND THE PROXIMITY OF FIRE STATIONS), THE WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM, AND EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, HELPS INSURANCE COMPANIES SET PREMIUMS FOR RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL PROPERTIES.

THERE ARE MANY OTHER TANGIBLE AND INTANGIBLE BENEFITS TO LIST, AND I WELCOME ANY THOUGHTS AND OPINIONS, SO I ENCOURAGE ALL RESIDENTS, WHEN CONSIDERING THIS OR ANY OTHER CITY SERVICE, TO EVALUATE THE VALUE RATHER THAN JUST THE COSTS. IF YOU ARE INTERESTED IN BECOMING A MEMBER OF OUR FIRE/EMS FAMILY, PLEASE FEEL FREE TO REACH OUT TO ME.

COUNCIL'S COMMENTS

NAVIGATING DIFFERING VOICES IN LOCAL GOVERNANCE

AS A LOCAL ELECTED OFFICIAL. I FIND IMMENSE JOY IN SERVING OUR COMMUNITY. EACH INTERACTION. WHETHER AT A TOWN HALL MEETING OR A CASUAL CHAT ON THE STREET. REMINDS ME OF THE VIBRANT TAPESTRY OF OPINIONS THAT MAKE OUR COMMUNITY. FROM RESIDENTS ADVOCATING FOR MORE GREEN SPACES TO THOSE PRIORITIZING INDIVIDUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS. THE SPECTRUM OF PERSPECTIVES IS QUITE DIVERSE. UNDERSTANDING THIS VARIETY ISN'T JUST PART OF THE JOB-IT'S WHAT MAKES IT FUN. CHALLENGING, AND AT TIMES STRESSFUL. HOWEVER, IT IS CHALLENGE THAT WILL MAKE OUR COMMUNITY THAT MUCH BETTER TOMORROW.

OVER THE PAST 3.5 YEARS OF SERVING AS A CITY COUNCILMEN. I HAVE OFTEN THOUGHT ABOUT THE TIMELESS WISDOM OF KING SOLOMON. IN THE BIBLICAL STORY. SOLOMON FACED TWO WOMEN CLAIMING MOTHERHOOD OVER THE SAME BABY. A DILEMMA THAT SEEMED IMPOSSIBLE TO RESOLVE WITHOUT HEARTBREAK. HIS CLEVER PROPOSAL TO DIVIDE THE CHILD REVEALED THE TRUE MOTHER'S SELFLESSNESS. ALLOWING JUSTICE TO PREVAIL THROUGH INSIGHT RATHER THAN FORCE, SIMILARLY, IN MUNICIPAL GOVERNANCE. WE ENCOUNTER SITUATIONS WHERE COMPETING INTERESTS—SUCH AS BUDGETS FOR PUBLIC SAFETY VERSES ROADS-PULL IN OPPOSITE DIRECTIONS. THROUGH THESE COMPLEX SITUATIONS WE STRIVE FOR DECISIONS THAT HONOR THE GREATEST COMMUNAL GOOD. TURNING POTENTIAL CONFLICTS INTO OPPORTUNITIES FOR UNDERSTANDING AND UNITY. WHAT KEEPS THIS COMPLEX DANCE REWARDING IS THE GENUINE FULFILLMENT THAT COMES FROM PROGRESS. NO MATTER HOW INCREMENTAL. I'VE WITNESSED FIRSTHAND HOW THOUGHTFUL COMPROMISE CAN TRANSFORM A HEATED DEBATE INTO A COLLABORATIVE TRIUMPH. LIKE WHEN WE MEDIATED BETWEEN NEIGHBORS CONCERNING LAND DISAGREEMENTS. IT'S IN THESE MOMENTS THAT THE JOY OF THE ROLE SHINES BRIGHTEST. REMINDING ME THAT WHILE WE CAN'T FULFILL EVERY INDIVIDUAL DEMAND, THE PURSUIT OF FAIRNESS BUILDS A STRONGER, MORE COHESIVE COMMUNITY. ULTIMATELY, SERVING AS YOUR ELECTED OFFICIAL IS A PRIVILEGE THAT FILLS ME WITH OPTIMISM FOR OUR FUTURE. LIKE SOLOMON. MANY OF THE FRUSTRATIONS. DISAGREEMENTS. PASSIONATE OPINIONS. PLACE US IN A SITUATION WHERE WE. THE ELECTED OFFICIALS. ARE PLACED IN A POSITION WHERE WE "NEED TO SPLIT THE BABY". MANY TIMES OUR HANDS ARE TIDE BY UTAH STATE LAW OR CITY ORDINANCE. BUT WHEN THEY ARE NOT WE APPRECIATE YOUR UNDERSTANDING AS WE COME TO THE BEST OUTCOME POSSIBLE. OVER THE YEARS IT HAS BEEN INSPIRING TO SEE PEOPLE WHO DISAGREE GAIN UNDERSTANDING. COME TOGETHER ON A SOLUTION. AND THEN CONTINUE TO MAKE OUR CITY EVEN BETTER. MAY WE ALL CONTINUE TO WORK TOGETHER TO CONTINUE TO MAKE WOODLAND HILLS ONE OF THE GREATEST CITIES TO CALL HOME.
